The riders will learn the ins and outs of competition in a comfortable, relaxed setting that focuses on having fun. Day 2 of the weekend gives rookies a chance to show off what they've learned and compete against one another on both a team and an individual level with the guidance of their professional trainer.

This event is designed for two levels of riders; those that qualify for Rookie Level I have not earned more than \$750 in a box only class and Rookie Level II are for those that have not earned more than \$750 in a fence class. It is to encourage riders to embrace the show experience; whether you are new to the sport, are trying to overcome anxiety in the show arena, advancing to a fence class, or are introducing a new horse to the event. This weekend is designed for you! Green, 1K, Novice Non-Pro, and Rookie Professional Riders are all welcome!!

The cost of this two-day event is \$275 per participant and includes a stall for the weekend.
